Bird Safe Philly completed over **30** outreach events including presentations, Bird Safe Schools lessons, retrofitting projects, tabling, an online auction and several news articles.

Highlights include presentations with the Bird Club of Delaware County, Free Library of Philadelphia, ANS Black Birding Gala, Disability Pride PA Parkway Celebration, Black Excellence in Birding, Earth Day Events, and Bucks County Birders.

Bird Safe Philly delivered **4** Bird Safe Schools lessons and completed **6** days of Feather Friendly dot installations at Springside Chestnut Hill Academy.

Over **125** Bird Safe Philly volunteer hours were dedicated to these events.

Bird Safe Philly reached over **500** people through these events and **1,800** followers through our Facebook and Instagram posts.

CLEAR WINNERS

Options abound for window treatments to keep birds safe—many easy to make or install yourself. Find a method that fits your budget and preferences.



INSECT SCREENS

One of the most effective collision deterrents—when installed on the exterior of windows—does double duty by also keeping unwanted bugs out of your home.



HANGING CORDS

Either secured above and below or left to dangle in the breeze, closely spaced vertical cords on the outside of windows prevent most strikes—and many enjoy the design.



PATTERNED DOTS

On window exteriors, place ready-made films or tape or paint your own dots no more than 2" vertically and 4" horizontally apart (or even better for tiny birds: in a 2"-by-2" grid).

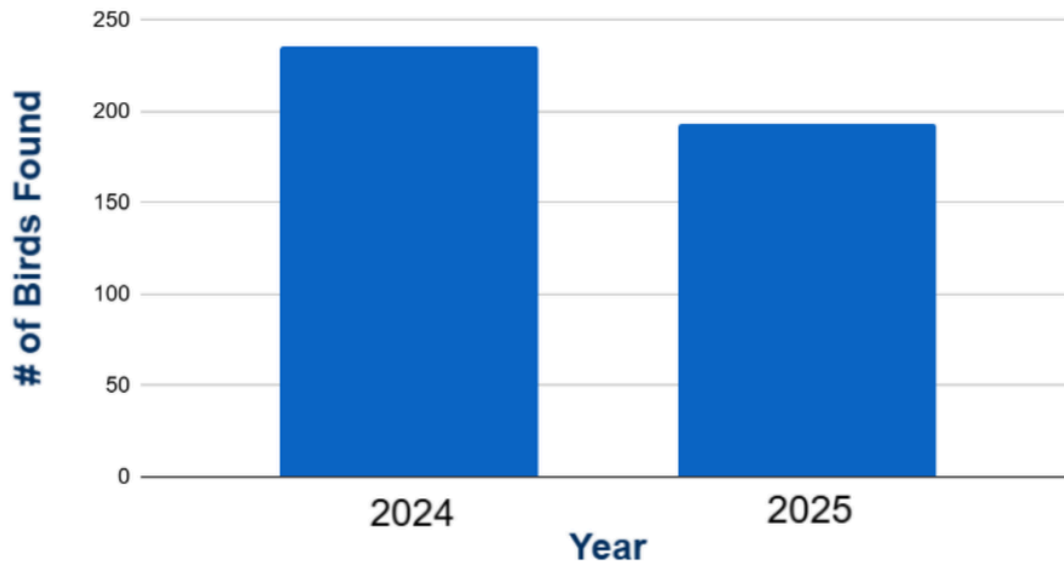
